About Our Center

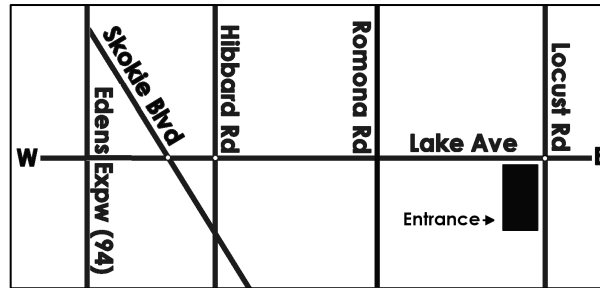
The Wilmette Family History Center is a branch of the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. It is open to the public free of charge. Everyone is welcome!

Our center is staffed by volunteers who understand the basic principles of family history research. They can guide you in using the Family History Center's resources and equipment and can suggest local libraries, archives, and societies that also provide genealogical and historical information.

Planning a Visit

If you're planning a visit to our center to begin your genealogy, write down what you know about the family you want to research—names, dates, and places—and choose a research goal. This will help our volunteers to best assist you.

If you're an experienced family history researcher, you may want to search the online Family History Library Catalog at <www.familysearch.org> to see what records are available for your research before visiting our center. Feel free to call ahead to see if we have the films you need or if you would have to order them from Salt Lake.

How to Find Us

Our center is housed in a stone church building—The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints Stake Center—on the SW corner of Lake & Locust.

North on the Edens: Exit at Lake Avenue, going east. Pass through stoplights at Skokie Blvd. and Hibbard Rd. Watch for the church building on your right just before the stoplight at Locust.

South on the Edens: Exit at Skokie Blvd/Route 41, going south and turn left onto Lake Ave. Pass through the stoplight at Hibbard Rd and watch for the church building on your right just before the stoplight at Locust.

Public Transportation: Take the 422 Pace Bus (Lake Avenue) from the Linden El Station or the Wilmette Metra stop and get off at the corner of Lake and Locust.

A digital copy of the information will be preserved in the Granite Mountain Records Vault near Salt Lake, and the information may be made available to researchers worldwide on CD-ROM or online. There is no fee for contributing to or using the Pedigree Resource File. Our volunteers can give you more information.

Fees

There is no cost to visit our center or to use our on-site resources, but we charge a small fee for film orders, copies, and other materials.

- Microfilm orders: \$5.50
- Microfiche orders: \$1.50
- Copies from film: \$.35/ea
- Photocopies: \$.10/ea
- Laser printer copies: \$.05/ea

We offer country, state, and ethnic research outlines, genealogical word lists and letter-writing guides for languages other than English, blank forms, and other materials at cost. Fees subject to change.
